## Sunday, 1 June Arrival and Exploration

Arrive in Adelaide and use our ground transport shuttle to head into the city and settle into the Hotel. In the evening, we'll kick things off with a relaxed social gathering at a local Hotel, the perfect chance to meet your colleagues.

## Monday, 2 June Deep Dive

Our deep dive begins at Immanuel College and Immanuel Primary, where school leaders will share their story of change that has been data informed and grounded in Growing Deep. We will hear both a primary and a secondary perspective. In the afternoon we will engage in a workshop with your immersion leaders to start the empathise and explore stage of the design process that will weave its way across the week.

## Tuesday, 3 June Student Engagement

We will spend the day with Andrew Plastow, Principal of Ngutu College as he shares the fascinating story of how this school came to be. Andrew will share their student engagement strategy and how they are using a Reggio Emilia inspired approach to learning and deep community connections to ensure that learners experience meaning and purpose across their schooling experience. In the afternoon we will head to Youth Inc. A school that's purpose is to re-engage young people to finish secondary school with a personalised approach. The team will share how they do education differently and are pushing the boundaries of what school could be in order to better meet the needs of young people.

## Wednesday, 4 June Free to Flourish

Today we head to the Barossa to visit Good Shepherd Angaston where Principal Darren Altus will share how his school is bringing Free to Flourish to life. The team has used Free to Flourish to create clarity about their vision for learning and how to bring that into fruition to ensure that learning is adventurous, compassionate, purposeful and relational. After an inspiring morning, we will head back to Adelaide to begin the journey home.
